Kia ora Ormond School Whānau,

TERM 1 ATTENDANCE DATA REPORT

As we move further into the term, I want to take a moment to discuss an essential aspect of students' success: consistent attendance. Every day spent in the classroom is a building block for a child's future. Our goal is to get 100% of our students attending school at least 90% of the time.

Our Term 1 attendance report from the MOE has provided us with the following data:

- Category 1: Regular attendance: Good chance of success: Over 90% attendance: Less than 5 days absence in a school term: Ormond percentage: 46% of students
- Category 2: Irregular attendance: Worrying, Less chance of success: More than 80% and up to 90% attendance: Between 6 – 10 days absence in a school term: Ormond percentage: 30% of students
- Category 3: Moderate attendance: Concerning, Hard to make progress: More than 70% and up to 80% attendance: Between 11 – 15 days absence in a school term: Ormond percentage: 18% of students
- Category 4: Chronic attendance: Serious concern, Very hard to make progress: 70% attendance or less: 15 days or more of absence in a school term: Ormond percentage: 7% of students

This is pretty confronting reading – as it shows that under half of our students had regular attendance in term one. According to MOE research regarding attendance, this means that only 46% of our students were given a "good chance" of experiencing success. The other 54% either have worrying, concerning, or seriously concerning attendance rates meaning they will find it hard to make progress and this equates to less chance of success.

It is important to note that this research has been done by the MOE and focuses solely on how attendance rates collate to student success at school nationwide – regardless of teaching capability, learning capacity, or individual school performance.

As a school, we would obviously like to see our attendance data improve – to our goal as stated – 100% of our students attending school at least 90% of the time.

Ensuring our students show up gives them the best chance of success. Attendance isn't just about following rules; it's about opportunity. When students are here, they benefit from:

- Academic Momentum: Lessons build upon one another. Missing even one or two days can create "learning gaps" that make it difficult for students to keep up with new concepts.
- Social Connection: School is where children navigate friendships and collaborate. Regular attendance strengthens these bonds and ensures every child feels they belong.
- The Power of Routine: Consistency reduces anxiety. When children know what to expect each day, they feel more secure and confident in their environment.

We have set an ambitious attendance target at Ormond, and we need your partnership to reach it. We are making this effort not for the sake of the numbers, but for the growth of our children.

ATTENDANCE

The more students are absent from school, the less chance they have for success – especially within academic attainment.

With the MOE raising the bar with the new NZ curriculum – increasing what students should know and understand within each year group – it is especially important that children are at school as much as possible. Each week a report is generated which shows how our kura is doing in relation to the overall goal of having most students attend school at least 90% of the time. This has been attached below.

As part of the attendance initiative – when students move between the zones – green, yellow, orange and red – parents and caregivers will be contacted by their child's teacher to check in and have a korero. Some may also receive an email / letter outlining the worry about missed learning time, and the goal of improving attendance.

These letters are templated via the MOE – but sent out by schools across the country (Please note that this response is aligned with students being Truant / or unexplained absence).

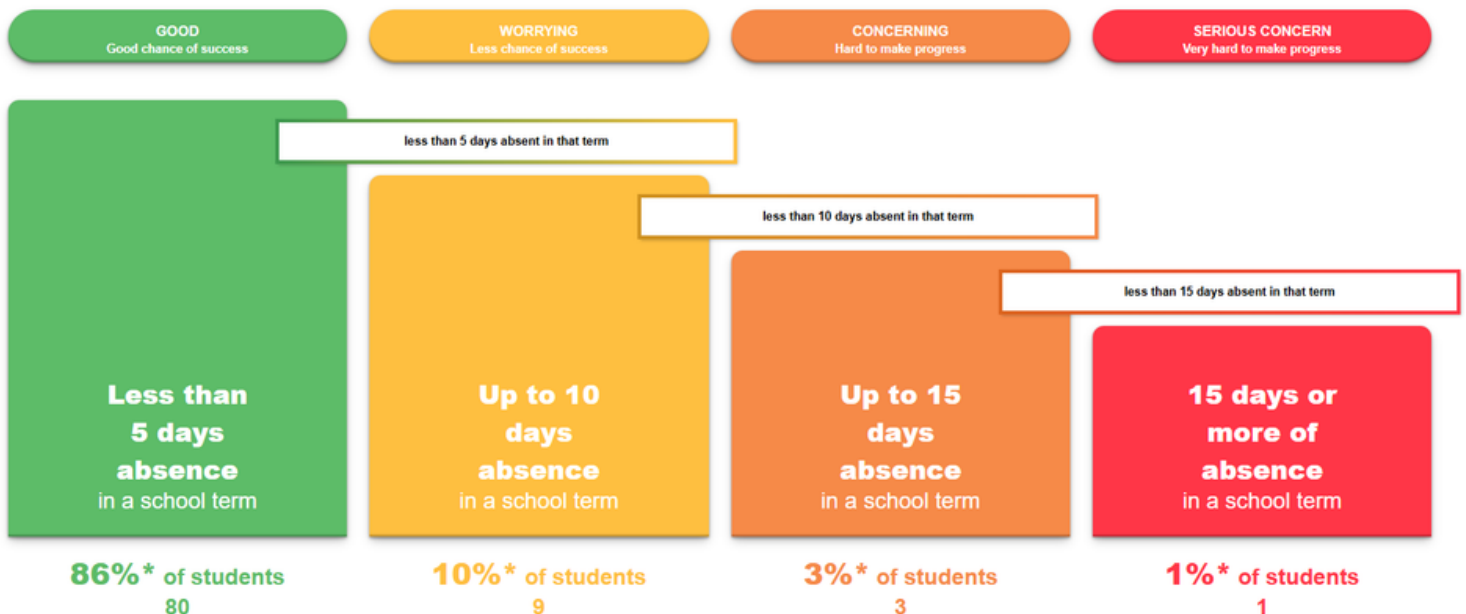

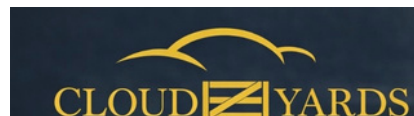
